North Island

AUCKLAND (104.6 Planet FM) Major broadcaster of ethnic programmes, broadcasting in more than 50 languages. Health education programmes and the disabilities sector are also included. Communities on air include: Philippines, India, France, Niue, Croatia, Nepal, Pacific nations, Ireland, Sri Lanka, Cambodia, Korea, South Africa, Bangladesh, Russia, Indonesia, Latin America, Somalia, Assyria, Zimbabwe and more.

HAMILTON (106.7FM Community Radio Hamilton) Similar ethnic range to Auckland but the communities are smaller and include recently arrived refugees from Afghanistan, Iraq and Ethiopia. There are also programme making communities of Fijian Indians, Dutch, Chinese and other Asian ethnicities. Music, expressions of different faiths and community activities are a focus.
